Meet Ollie...



On a freezing February morning a little dog was found eating out of a trash can in a local trailer park. Cold, scared, starving and filthy, he had no collar, no microchip and his "person" never responded to Lost and Found postings or made attempts to locate him.

While at the Burney Veterinary Hospital for his SNIPPP intake check up, he stole Samantha's heart. She offered to foster him and after just one night it was clear that the little dog, now named Ollie, had found his forever home. Samantha and her 5 year old daughter Gabrielle adopted him from SNIPPP. Ollie now lives the good life with a warm bed, a full belly and all the love he deserves. He even enjoys the indignity of being dressed up in baby clothes and taken for a ride in Gabrielle's baby stroller.

Soon Samantha noticed that Ollie often favored his rear legs. He was diagnosed with luxating patellas; his knee caps would pop out of place and stay that way, making it painful for him to bend his legs. For a single mom surgery was an impossible expense. Ollie was only a year old. How could he live like this for the rest of his life? Devastated. Samantha contacted SNIPPP.

Thanks to a grant provided by The Pedigree Foundation combined with some of your donations to SNIPPP, Ollie had the surgery he needed. He is expected to live a long, pain free life with the family that loves him. It's because of the generosity and compassion of donors like you that Ollie was able to get the surgery he needed. But SNIPPP could not have afforded to pay for Ollie's surgery without The Pediaree Foundation grant. SNIPPP's 2011 Accomplishments

- Found new homes for 24 dogs and 20 kittens rescued in the Intermountain Area; 15 more puppies and dogs were transferred to other rescues for faster adoption.
- Issued spay or neuter vouchers for 609 cats and dogs, preventing unwanted litters.
- Reunited 43 dogs and 1 cat with their owners through our Lost and Found service.
- Helped owners find new homes for 51 dogs and 36 cats through www.snippp.org, SNIPPP's Courtesy Listing service.

Spay & Neuter Vouchers

Need to spay or neuter your pet or feral cat? Do it now to prevent unwanted litters. Call your vet to make your appointment and then call SNIPPP at 336-6006 with the details.

Due to a special grant, "super" vouchers are available until funds run out: \$80 per dog spay, \$50 per dog neuter, \$60 per cat spay and \$20 per cat neuter.

Sebastian in "His Chair"



A couple of years ago, a SNIPPP Board member fostered this Lab/Pit Bull mix with issues. He refused to get in a car. He didn't do well with new people, and overall it seemed he might not be easily adoptable. Tony, a fishing guide in Eureka, saw "Jake" at www.snippp.org and drove all the way to PETCO in Redding to meet him and take him to his forever home where he is Tony's fishing companion. Here's what Tony says: "The pink scarf was a present from (a favorite client) and he loves it. He's become such an amazingly well behaved dog. At the end of a fishing day we've floated about 10 miles of river and I have to get a ride back to my truck in the client's car which we leave at takeout...(it) takes about 45 As I'm leaving I say, minutes. "Sebastian, stay in your chair please" and he won't move a muscle the entire time I'm gone no matter what the temptation. The connection we've developed by spending 99% of our time together is really special. I usually speak to him in complete sentences and in a quiet, subdued tone and he always responds perfectly. "Sebastian, we need to go. Get in the car please." or "Sebastian, stay close. You're going too far". While I realize he doesn't understand every word, he's incredibly adept at pulling the meaning out of what I'm saying and cooperating. In short, I adore him!"

It's the Law!

Effective January 1, 2012 there is a new law in California to protect animals. It is now against the law to try to sell or give animals away in a public area. For example, it is against the law to park outside of Safeway to try to sell or give away puppies or kittens.

RECYCLE for SNIPPP



He ended up at the County Shelter in Redding where he twice came within a day of being put to sleep. When he was nearly out of time, the Shelter called SNIPPP and one of our Board members made the last minute run down the hill to save Lucky's life. Now he needs a forever family of his very own. Lucky is about 2 years old and 67 pounds. He is housetrained and has an attractive easy-care coat. He gets along well with other dogs and cats and likes to Lucky knows some play fetch. commands and is a well-behaved, easy going, happy and affectionate sweet guy. 
Our <u>Chrissie's Fund</u> grant expires June 2012, but we are applying for continued support. This grant pays for rescue services for older mixed breed dogs over 50 pounds. For low income area residents with dogs 50 pounds and larger, these funds also fully pay for spay and neuter surgery and vaccinations. Special funds pay for spay and neuter super vouchers.

2011 86% SNIPPP's of expenditures were for the care and services for animals and for spay and neuter vouchers. SNIPPP doesn't have an office or any paid staff. Our expenses for things like mailing supplies, phone and insurance are low. Fundraising includes the BBQ and green and cart fees for the Golf Tournament fundraiser which are totally offset by Tournament entry fees. The cost of color printing this Newsletter was donated.
